President's Plans and Projections for the United Student Movement for the 2017-2018 Regime.

1. Assist Administration in the Improvement of Facilities:

As the president of the movement I will be trying my very best to work with the maintenance department to make sure that student affiliated infrastructure are properly put in place. The Vice President of Finance and Planning along with the Vice President Academics will bring a report to the USM Executive Council at the end of each month. This report will answer questions such as:

- Is the class room conducive to proper learning?
- Are there any hazards on campus that will cause incidents on campus?
- Is the campus properly lighted for students who stay here in the nights?

2. Get 10 % for NCU Students

Along with another student, I have completed approximately thirty short interviews with managers, supervisors, etc. and share our Idea with them and they are willing to be a part of this venture. 5. Tuck Shop- Extension to the Cafeteria

The school's Cafeteria (Sorenson Hall) along with the food outlets at the Tai Centre are extremely clustered during peak hours which cause students to leave without eating and the university's food services lose that customer, therefore there is need for another food outlet on the campus in order to provide revenue for the cafeteria and a more easier access to food for the students.

6. Just two of many Continuations

- Continuation of the outgoing Finance and Planning Office's meal voucher initiative: the allocation and authorization of the disbursement of USM Meal Vouchers in the various Colleges of the University.
- The book voucher and scholarship threshold will be widened so a greater number of students can have access to scholarship, grants and book incentives.

7. Appoint an International Student Representative

The only time international student gets full representation in the united student movement executive council is if an international student is a part of the executive body. With me in the position as a president, I will appoint through interview an international student representative who will bring all concerns on behalf of the international student. This person is to be the chief consultant to the President and will be an ex-officio to all Executive Council Meeting that relates

The chief appointment of the first international student representative is to create a journal for all new international students so they can navigate the campus, the town of Mandeville and the surrounding communities better.

8. "The Presidents Round Table"

This “President Roun Table” will consist of 10-13 Students who will be advisors to the President and will give every department a chance to be the president’s advisor.

- One representative from each dorm
