ENGLISH AND MODERN LANGUAGES

JET PROGRAMME

The Japan Exchange and Teaching (JET) Program invites university graduates from overseas to participate in internal exchange and foreign language education throughout Japan. Established in 1987, the program has earned a high reputation, both in Japan and overseas, for its efforts in youth and cultural exchanges, and has become one of the largest exchange programs in the world. JET Program participants work as either Assistant Language Teachers (ALT) who are placed mainly in local boards of education or public junior and senior high schools to assist with English-language education, or as Coordinators for International Relations (CIR), who work in offices of local government authorities or related organizations engaged in internationalization activities. Since the program's inception, over 44,000 people have participated in the program.
