





Transfer	Transfer with at least sophomore standing from a recognized tertiary institution
	Completion of a diploma or an associate degree from a recognized tertiary institution. NCU students receiving the associate degree must apply for admission into the baccalaureate programme
Mature Age Examination	Applicants over the age of 25 may be granted admission based on their work experience, maturity and performance in the University's Mature Age Examination (MAE) for selected programmes. (See page 166 of the Undergraduate Bulletin)
Chemistry Requirement	Applicants who do not have a pass in Chemistry will be matriculated into the Department after successfully completing CHEM111 & 112 Introduction to Chemistry I & II, with no grade lower than "C". Except for BSC in Biochemistry.
Biology Requirement	Applicants who do not have a pass in will be matriculated into the Department after successfully completing BIOL101 & 102 Principles of Biology I and II, with no grade lower than "C".






